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CHILD GUIDANCE'S ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

When a child is struggling emotionally, behaviorally, developmentally, or is diagnosed on the autism spectrum or with a developmental disability, it is crucial to provide them with support to address their specific needs. At times, a child may need customized care to help him/her develop the skills necessary to grow and thrive in an academic environment.

Child Guidance offers a comprehensive program specifically created for children who are challenged in the public school classroom. Our structured academic environment combined with daily group, individual counseling and on-site psychiatric services provides the safe and supportive environment students need.

We are dedicated to working with the school district and to helping children develop the skills necessary to return to public school with great success. The school receives a quarterly report card, invitations to attend IEP meetings, updated original IEP documents, access to individual academic charts, the opportunity to consult with Child Guidance regarding emotionally challenged children, transition help, and our commitment to follow the same academic standards established by the state of Pennsylvania.

HOW DO I REFER A CHILD?

Enrollment in our program is based on a recommendation made in a child's Individual Education Plan (IEP). School districts, teachers, and psychologists are generally aware if a child's behavior might warrant a placement outside of the regular school programming. If/when the school district is unable to offer appropriate in-district emotional support services; they will generally offer families alternative placement options.

School districts will send Child Guidance a copy of the IEP and Evaluation Report (ER) or contact the director. If we are able to facilitate the IEP, the school district will be notified and a brief tour for the family and child will be arranged with the program director. After the family and the school district agree to this placement, Child Guidance will issue a standard contract to the school district if one is not already in place.
